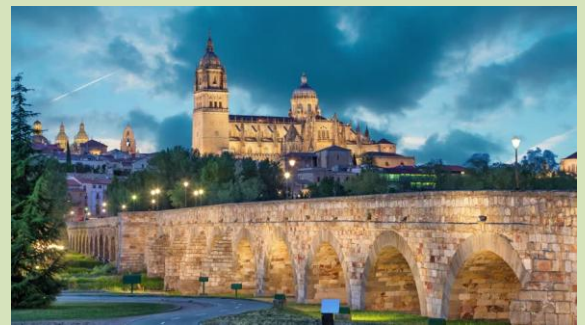
Chelmsford u3a Spanish Conversation Group Thrives!



The Chelmsford u3a Spanish Conversation Group has continued to flourish since its online beginnings during Covid. Now meeting in person on the third Wednesday of each month, the group brings together a wonderfully mixed range of members — from those who have lived or worked in Spain or Latin America to others who began learning online.

We are also fortunate to have a native Spanish speaker, whose insights into how Spanish is spoken in real life add huge value to every session.

Our meetings start with a friendly catch-up in Spanish before moving into varied activities such as crosswords, "Just a Minute"-style speaking games, and discussions based on newspaper or magazine articles brought in by members. Conversations often wander into unexpected topics, but as long as we're speaking Spanish, it all helps build confidence and fluency.

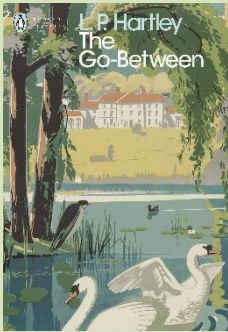

A Case of Mistaken Identity - leading to u3a publicity

Ben Musgrave of UAE (University of East Anglia) had been researching the novel *The Go-Between* by L.P. Hartley, widely believed to have been inspired by the author's experience of Bradenham, Norfolk: its landscape, customs, and people. You may recall the film. As part of this research, he had visited Bradenham, given a lecture locally and staged a public script reading of a new production in progress at Norwich Theatre Studio 2. He was now planning a free creative writing workshop in Bradenham, focusing on memories of the district, and sought local contacts to help promote the event. The first I found out about this was when I was copied into an extensive correspondence chain between the Ben and St Andrew's Church. The relevant part of the conversation was thus:

But of particular relevance – is we have a UEA lecturer in Creative Writing = Laurene Henderson (long-term village-res; generally one of the regular coffee-group) – and I was strongly advised to put the two of you in touch.

Flattering though it was to be so exalted, I had to advise Ben that I was merely a Group Leader of Creative Writing for a local u3a, albeit with a first class honours degree in English (and Drama in Education). Nonetheless our conversation was very productive.

I advised Ben on suitable venues and who to contact. I suggested a way in which I could publicise it to my u3a Creative Writing Groups (we have 2) and Playscript Readers (again 2) via Beacon, and I put him in touch with other u3as in the immediate area. It will also go out on our newsletter and Facebook page.



As a result, Ben increased his bookings for the free course, and has alerted the Development Manager at the theatre company and his UAE department about the u3a movement and its potential.

There was also a link to a theatre company, Eastern Angles who are staging a production of *The Go-Between*, which I was also able to help publicise (see above).

In fact, I was a *Go -Between* for the u3a and UAE!

I will be attending both events. Ben and I hope that this will lead to future links between the u3a and his project - and possibly others in the future. And all because of a misunderstanding...

Can you help research affecting older people?

TWO separate student researchers have been in touch looking for the experience of u3a members to help them.

The first is **Shannon Edwards a Trainee Clinical Psychologist on the Doctorate in Clinical Psychology programme at the University of Leicester**. She is currently conducting doctoral research exploring the experiences of adults aged 65 and over who have been affected by fraud or deception by someone they knew or trusted, such as a partner, family member, friend, or professional.



Her research aims to improve understanding of how these experiences affect older adults, inform clinical practice, and support the development of services and safeguarding strategies. Participation involves a confidential interview lasting up to 75 minutes, which can be conducted in person or online via Microsoft Teams.

All identifiable information will be removed to protect participants' identities.

Second is **Kate McKeown, Counselling Psychologist in Training at the University of South Wales**. She is exploring people's experience of living with a partner who has depression when aged 65 and over.

Research suggests partners often feel overwhelmed in their roles when their partner has depression. Kate is interested in individual stories to gain insights that may lead to more effective support in the future.

She would like to hear from you if:

- You and your partner are both 65 or over and you live together;
- Your partner has depression. (This does not have to be professionally diagnosed and is not a part of Bipolar Affective Disorder or a psychotic disorder);
- Your partner is not currently in hospital for their mental health and is not a risk to themselves, you or others;
- You live in the UK and communicate fluently in English.



Kate's research involves a 60 to 90 minutes confidential recorded interview with herself talking about your experiences. It can be online via Microsoft Teams or face-to-face at the University of South Wales Newport Campus.

She adds: "There are no right or wrong answers. I am interested in your story and experiences. All comments will be kept confidential."
